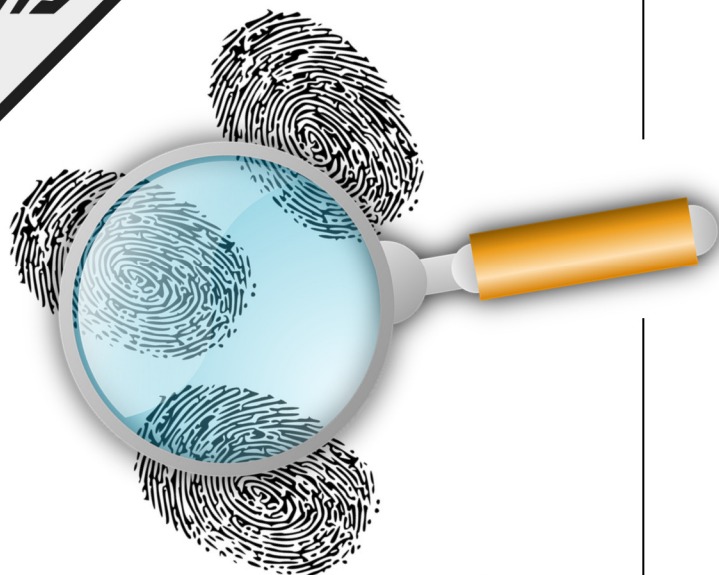

Welcome to camping in the Cascade Pacific Council!

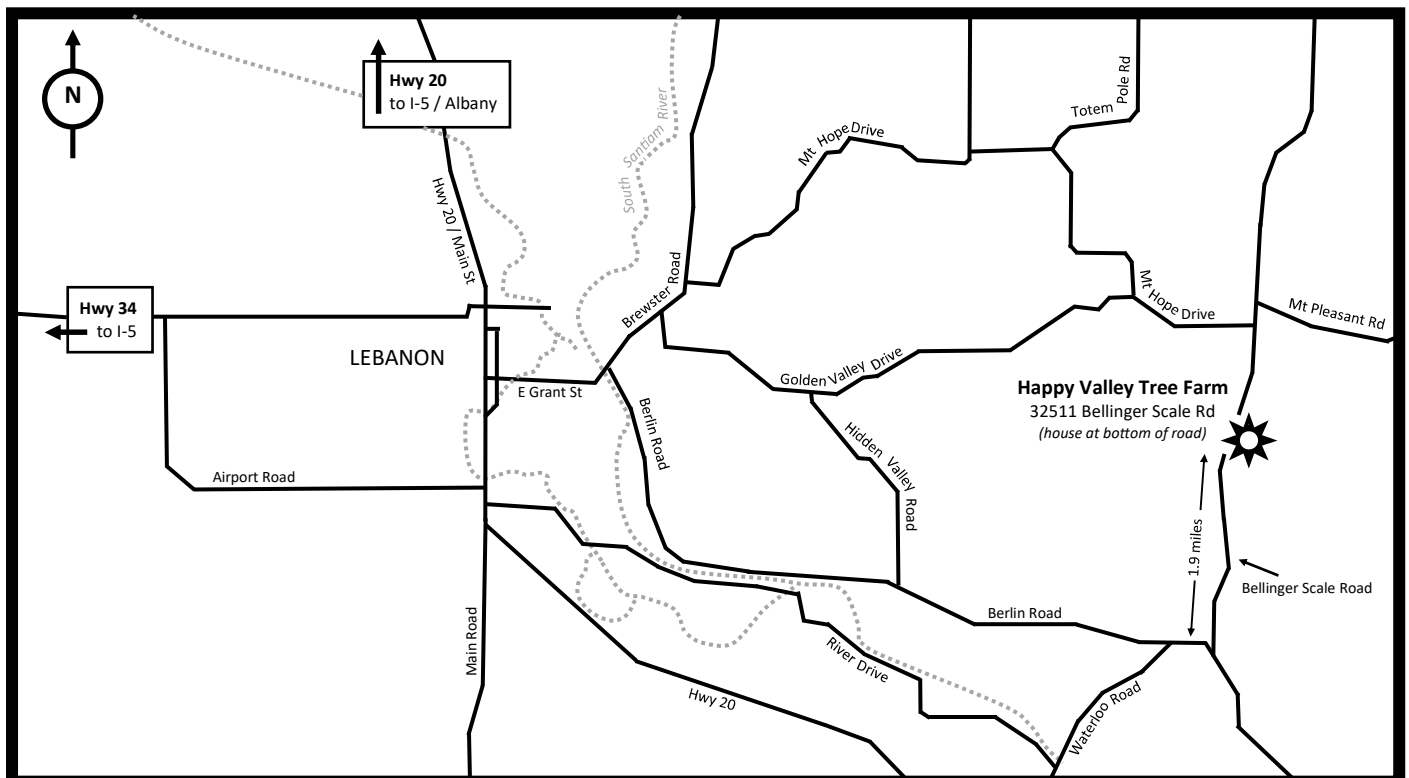
Welcome to Calapooia Day Camp nestled among the trees of the Happy Valley Tree Farm. Our day camp program is a great opportunity to introduce Lions, Tigers, Wolves, and Bears to a camp experience. We offer over 20 different activities including an archery range, BB range, scout skills, woodworking projects, STEM challenges, crafts, cooking and more that keep scouts engaged and active all day. It also provides an opportunity to meet new scouts and to develop teamwork.

For Webelos, most stations are modified to learn more advanced skills and a few activities are entirely with a focus on learning scout skills like knife safety, lashings, flag ceremonies, first aid, and compass skills.

Camp amenities include den picnic tables, kybos/ portable bathrooms, hand-washing stations and open field for games. There is a small camp trading post with some scout items and inexpensive trinkets. Our staff of volunteers, look forward to sharing the scouting spirit with your campers and creating lasting memories!

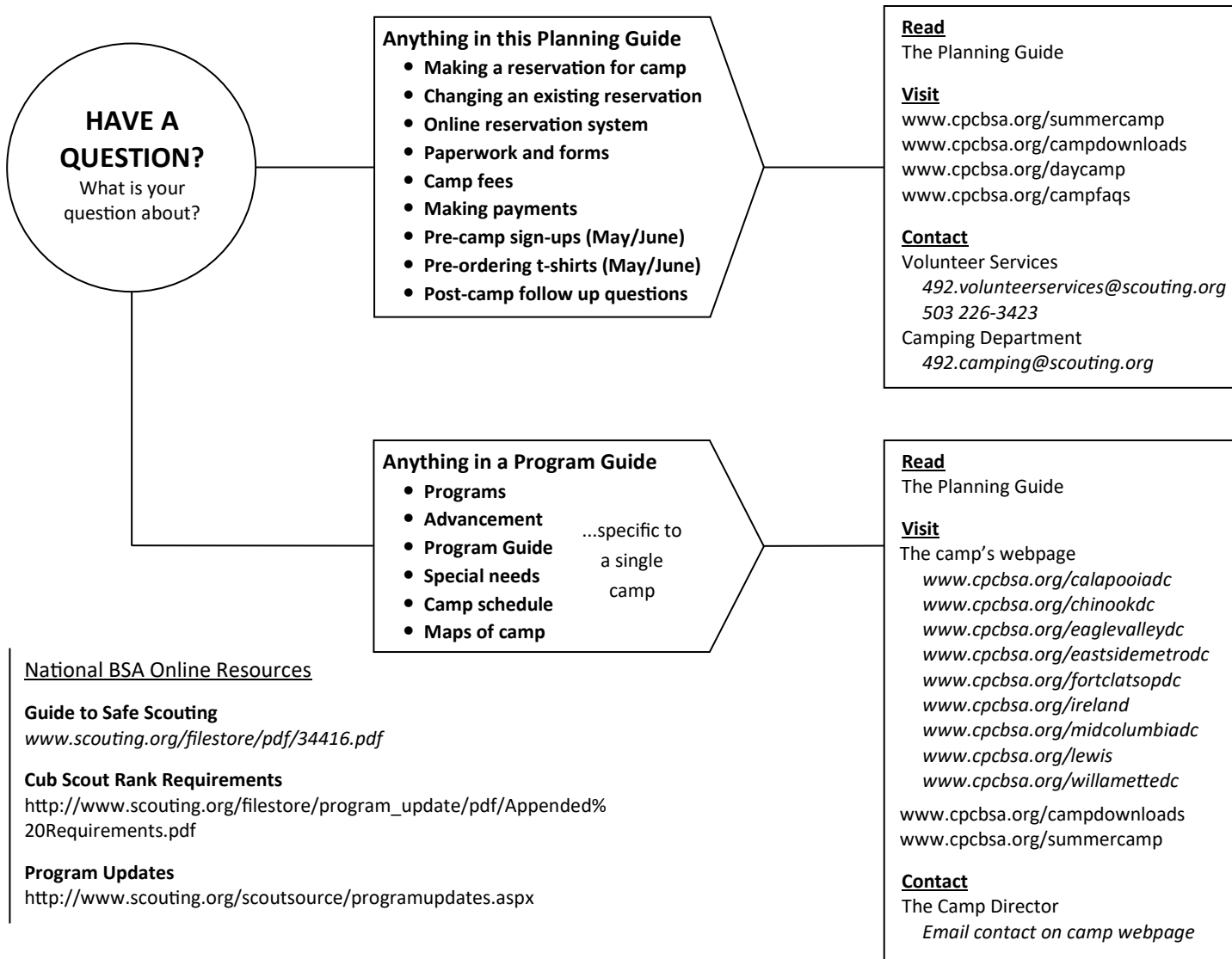

PRE-CAMP LEADER MEETING

Council staff and camp management will have an in-person meeting to share information about the upcoming camp season and to answer questions from adult leaders. Leaders and parents attending camp are all encouraged to attend. Pack leaders will also be able to pick up camp t-shirts that have been pre-ordered online before May 15.

Camp Check-in

All campers and adults must check in each day. As Campers and adults arrive, they will proceed through the following check-in tables:

1. **Pre-registered check-in** for campers who have pre-registered and have already paid in full.

Non-registered check-in for campers who have not pre-registered or who still owe fees

1. Medical form check & medical screening. Here is where you will turn in your medical forms. All medications will need to be submitted to Camp Medical offer on site. Medications must be in the original containers and the label must be clear.
2. Den assignments for youth
3. Duty assignments for adults to confirm their volunteer duty assignments

Check-in: Monday 8am

Tuesday –Thurs 8:45am

DROP OFF AND PICK UP

Drop-off

Monday Parents and carpool drivers must park and accompany their child/children to the check-in area. Staff must ensure each Cub's paperwork is complete and their Den Leader is there. Parents/drivers who are not volunteering at camp will then be free to leave once their child is with their Den Leader.

Tuesday-Thursday Parents may drive up to the check-in area, and if their child's Den Leader is there, they may drop off their child at that time. If they are not, they will need to circle around again or park until the Den Leader arrives. For their own safety, children are not to be left unsupervised!

Pick-up

You will be directed to loop around in the same way and pick up your children from the check out area. If you arrive before closing flag ceremony is completed, you will need to wait in you car outside of camp until we signal you to enter.

WHAT TO BRING TO CAMP

It is essential to a great experience at camp that you and your Pack come prepared. Here is a list of things to consider bringing (make sure everything is labeled):

- Medical form (Parts A & B)**
- Jacket/Sweatshirt
- Lunch
- Water Bottle
- Sun Screen
- Bug Spray
- Cooler
- Wagon

All Scouts & leaders are required to bring a current and complete BSA Medical Form, with all required signatures, with them to camp.

Day Camps require that **Parts A & B** are filled out completely.

Do not use other medical reports or forms; use the official BSA Medical Form only.

ADULT VISITORS

Adults who are not signed up to volunteer during camp are considered visitors. Visitors need to check in with camp management upon arrival and receive a wristband. Visitor's must also check out upon departure. This ensures the camp staff knows who is on property at all times.

TOT LOT

Children who are not currently registered with a pack attending camp may not stay in camp unless they meet one of these criteria:

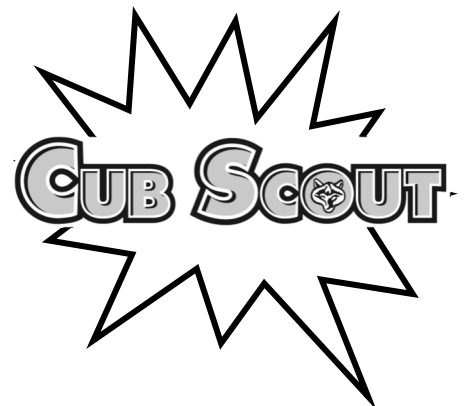
Adult leaders may make use of the Tot Lot on days they volunteer. If used youth age 3 to Kindergarten will need to be potty-trained and have medical forms part A and B.

DEN NAMES & FLAGS

Camp den names will be assigned by the camp and given out at the Pre-camp Meeting. This year flags will be provided by the camp, so it is not necessary to make your own. If you would like to work on getting the boys excited prior to camp, you can have them work on their den yell and den skit.

DEN YELLS & SKITS

Each camp den will come up with a den yell to use in response to roll call and as a spirit call. This also is lots of fun for the Scouts! Your den will be asked to prepare a skit or song to present during the final campfire.



CAMPFIRE PROGRAM

Immediately following the camp picnic/BBQ will be our campfire program. Each den will present a skit or a song. Awards and recognition will be presented along with camp patches. Medical forms are also returned to packs at this time.

PARENT VOLUNTEERS

The Calapooia Day Camp is an all-volunteer day camp. Most staff—youth and adults—are serving as volunteers. We always need additional station leaders and group leaders to assist each den with their rotations. There are also other camp positions available and we will try to match your interests with available positions. If you want to volunteer at camp, serve as a station leader, or have other questions about volunteering, please contact the Camp Director.

STILL HAVE QUESTIONS?

If you are still unsure about anything, please bring your questions to the pre-camp meeting. Keep in mind that the information in this packet is preliminary and is subject to change— any last-minute information updates will be made available when you arrive at camp. When you arrive at camp you will be given the most recent map and schedule for your group. Remember to pass information along to all the adults who will be attending with your group.
